

# Hanlon St Sewage Pump Station Upgrade

## Construction Update

In November 2024, Urban Utilities' delivery partner, John Holland commenced the final stage of the Hanlon Street Sewage Pump Station (SPS) upgrade.

The upgrade includes the construction of a new pump station adjacent to the existing sewer pump station at 62 Hanlon Street, Bundamba. Once the new pump station has been commissioned, the existing pump station will be decommissioned.

Since works commenced in November 2024, South-East Queensland has experienced above average rainfall, construction activities have been extended as the project team periodically has waited for drier ground conditions to continue progress.

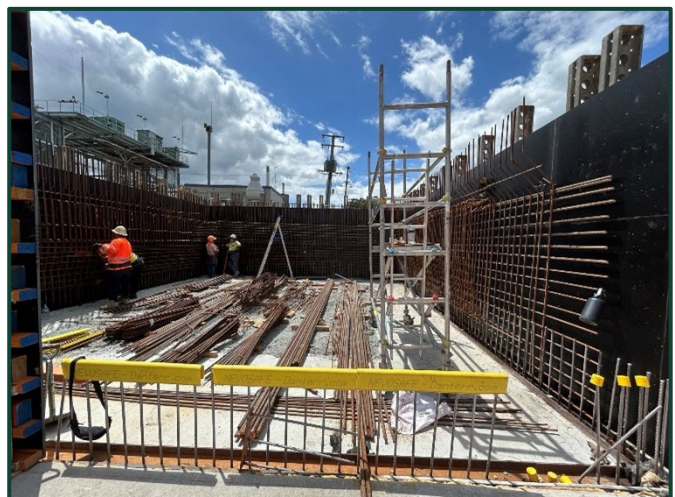
Saturday works have now commenced and will continue intermittently if required over the coming months; this is to ensure we continue to work within schedule.

## What's been completed?

Between November 2024 and February 2025 John Holland Group constructed their site office and laydown area located on Hart Street, Bundamba.

At 62 Hanlon Street, sewer pump station preparations were made by removing existing vegetation, constructing temporary access roads for machinery and a temporary rock filter to protect the Bundamba Creek during upgrade works.

February 2025 until June 2025 crews established working platforms to safely start construction of the new pump station dual well shaft.

## What's next?

With the first stages of the new pump station underway, our crew will continue construction on the dual wet well and renewal of two existing maintenance holes within the site.

## What to expect?

**Work hours** will be from Monday to Friday between 6:30am and 6:30pm with some Saturdays between 6:30am and 6:30pm as required.

**Noise** and dust during construction activities including operation of machinery and equipment.

**Intermittent odour** and noise during activities if a vacuum truck is required.

**Increase in vehicle** movements, including heavy vehicles at Hart and Hanlon Streets, and entering and exiting the site during work hours.

Local road access will be maintained during construction for residents and visitors. Traffic controllers will assist machinery and equipment for entry and existing site as required.

**Safety** barriers and signage will be in place around work areas to keep everyone safe.

We will make every effort to minimise impacts on the local community, including monitoring and managing noise and dust at the source.

Interruption to services is not expected during these works and traffic management will be arranged if required.
