

Working beneath the streets

Night work at Logan Road, Mount Gravatt

You can rely on us to keep things flowing, and from time-to-time we need to upgrade your local water and wastewater pipes.

What's happening?

Our delivery partner, Downer WSP, will soon start work on replacing sections of water pipes along Logan Road between Mountain Street and Gowrie Street, Mount Gravatt. Construction will start on **Sunday 28 August 2022**, and we expect to be finished in six weeks, weather and site conditions permitting.

Why is this happening?

We are replacing sections of water pipe near your property which are made from asbestos cement, the new pipes will be longer lasting. Upgrades to the network will ensure reliability and sustainability of water services in your area.

How will impacts be managed?

Hours – most of the work will take place at **night**, between **6pm and 6am, Sunday to Thursday**.

Night work is required to comply with approved traffic permits, to ensure the safety of our workers and to reduce the impacts of water outages to the community. We'll endeavour to complete high noise work as early as possible.

Safety – barriers and signage around work areas will be in place to keep everyone safe.

Traffic changes – possible lane and footpath closures around work sites. Traffic management will be in place to look after the safety of our pedestrians and road users.

Temporary water outages – we'll give you at least three days' notice before any planned water interruptions to your water supply. Keep a look out in your letterbox for these updates.

Noise and dust – unfortunately there will be varying levels during excavation. We will minimise these where we can.

Asbestos removal – there are no health risks associated with drinking water that has been transported in asbestos cement pipes. Our licensed asbestos removers will safely remove these

pipes by wetting down the asbestos cement before it is removed and disposing of these pipes in a special bin.

Temporary water service (bypass pipe) – Your property may be connected to a temporary water service pipe to maintain your water supply. The temporary pipe is usually laid across driveways, a crossing ramp will be used to maintain safe vehicle access and to protect the pipe. Please cross the ramp at a slow speed without stopping to avoid damaging it. This temporary water supply is the same quality of drinking water as your normal service; however, you may notice a slight reduction in water pressure.

Restoration – temporary restoration will occur while work is in progress. At completion, we'll restore as close to the original condition as possible including roads, driveways, footpaths, and nature strips that have been impacted by our works.
